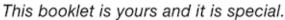

For you and your family to be treated kindly, fairly and with respect

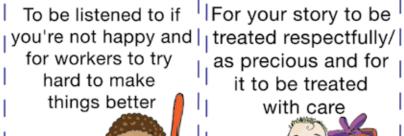


To be and feel safe

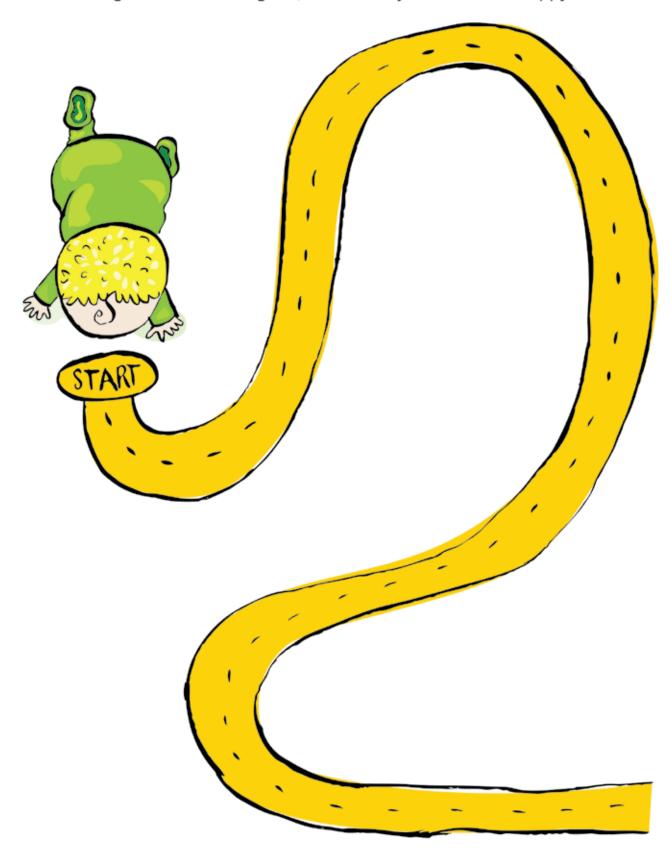

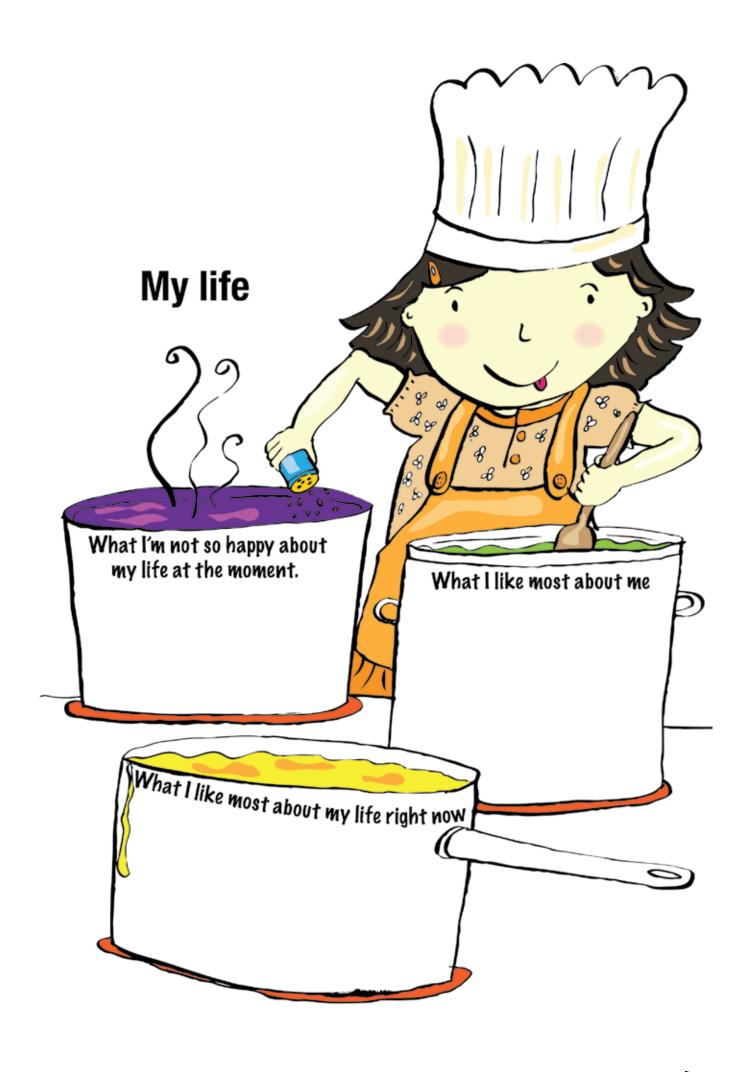

What are the important things that have happened to you on your journey? Are there things that have made you scared, worried or upset? Are there things that have been good, have made you feel safe or happy?

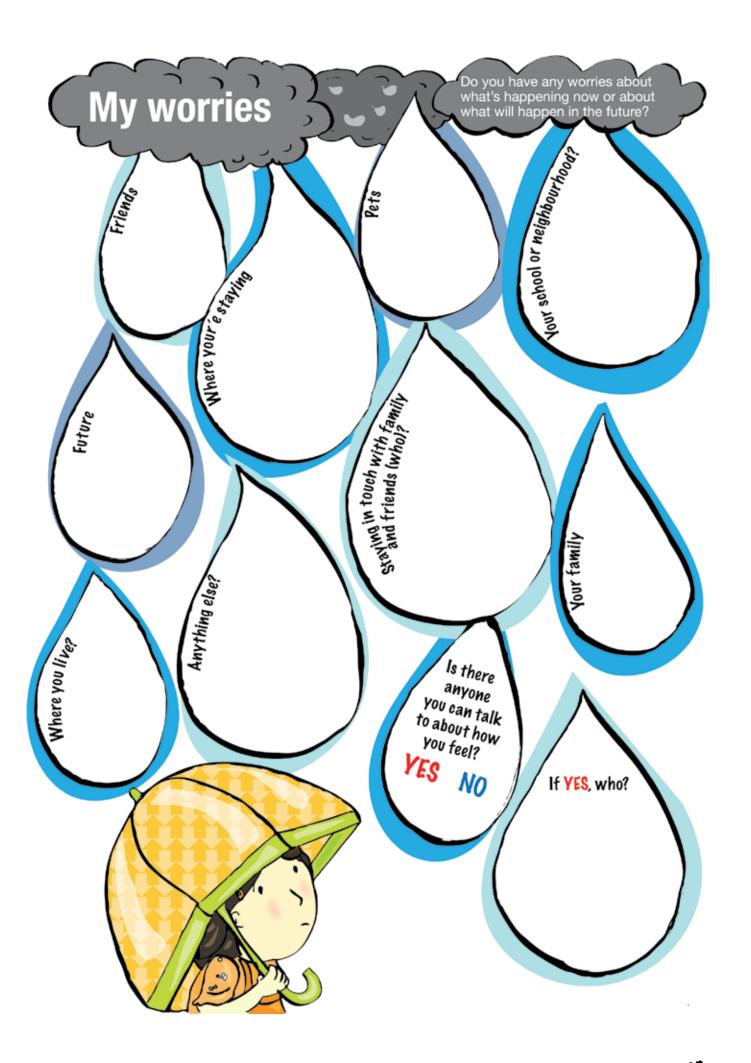


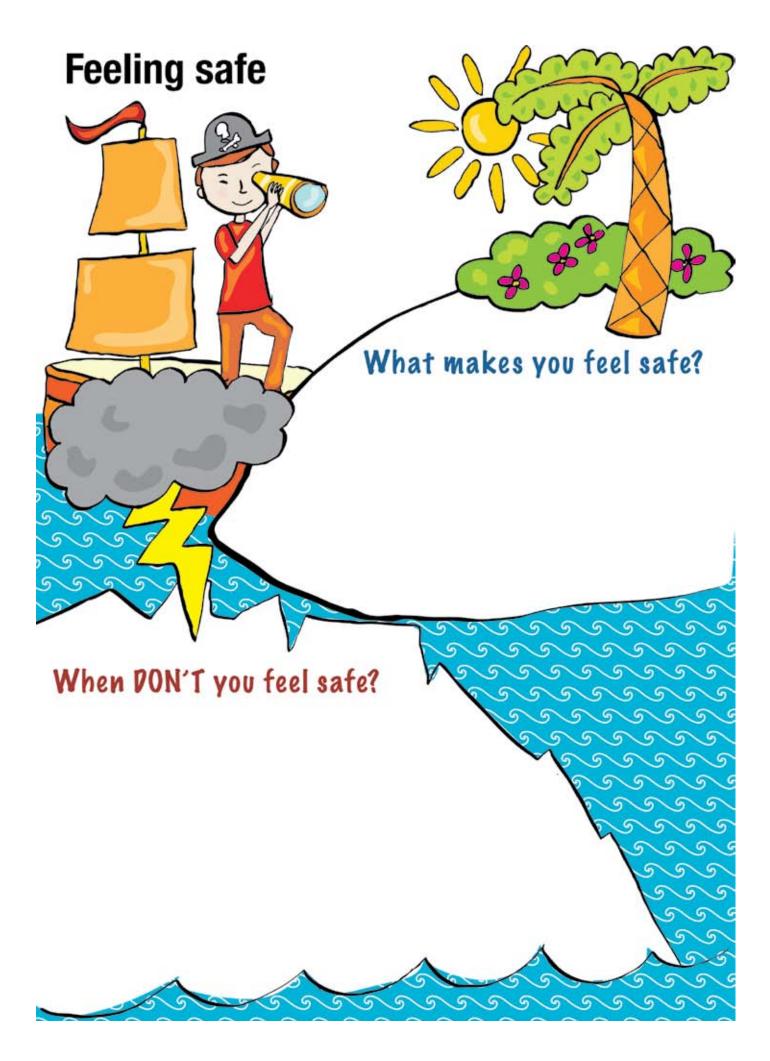
